The AAMC has just launched the AAMC Foundation Engagement Program for International Curators, with major support from the Terra Foundation for American Art. The aim of the Program is to provide opportunities for professional development and exchange within the curatorial field and to expand and strengthen the international curatorial community.

One element of the program includes a partnership between a US Liaison and the International Awardee, in which the Liaison provides guidance and support on research or non-research related topics set forth by the Awardee. The program offers many important benefits to the Liaison, including AAMC membership, waived registration to the AAMC Annual Conference & Meeting, and a stipend. It will also be a wonderful opportunity to forge a lasting relationship with an international colleague.
